#### Era #12 – The Church

## 1st & 2nd Thessalonians

Acts 16:8	Paul is in Troas on 2 <sup>nd</sup> missionary journey.	
Acts 16:9-10	Paul has a vision of a man from Macedonia saying, "Come over and help us."	
Acts 16:11-12	Paul and Silas leave and stop at Philippi.	
Acts 16:13-15	Paul and Silas witnessed in Philippi and started a church.	
Acts 16:16-34	Paul casts a demon out of a slave girl and they were beaten and spent a night in jail.	
Acts 16:35-40	The officials forced them to leave Philippi the next morning.	
Acts 17:1-4	Paul and Silas go to Thessalonica and preach for 3 weeks in the synagogue. They stayed longer than that. Many people were saved – Jews, Greeks, leading women of the city and idol worshiping pagans.	
Acts 17:5-9	This angered a group of Jews that other Jews were being saved. They stirred up a crowd to attack the home of Jason, where Paul and his associates were staying. They were not there.	
Acts 17:10	The Believers sent Paul and Silas away from the city at night to Berea.	
Acts 17:11-12	Many Jews were being saved in Berea.	
Acts 17:13	The Thessalonian Jews came to Berea and stirred up more trouble.	
Acts 17:14-15	The Berean Believers sent Paul to Athens, while Silas and Timothy stayed in Berea. Later Paul send for Silas and Timothy to join him.  Later – Paul sends Silas back to Philippi and Timothy to Thessalonica to check on the condition of the churches. They returned with their reports when Paul was in Corinth.	

#### Paul had 4 main purposes for writing his letters to the Believers in Thessalonica:

- 1. To encourage and commend the Believers for their spiritual growth and faithfulness.
- 2. To correct wrong information about him and his fellow missionaries that some critics in Thessalonica were circulating.
- 3. To give additional teachings to help the Believers continue to grow spiritually.
- 4. To correct the doctrinal error about the "day of the Lord."
